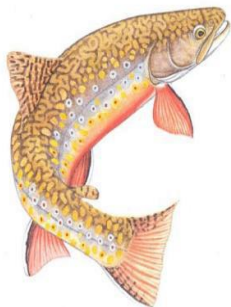

Rivercourse 2012, in its tenth session, is for boys and girls ages 13-15. This camp emphasizes Trout Unlimited's mission, the conservation of cold water fisheries, while at the same time teaching campers the basics of fly fishing, a sport for a lifetime.



Western North Carolina is home to what many of us consider the best trout waters east of the Mississippi River. Lake Logan is nestled deep in the heart of the Appalachian Mountains near Canton, NC. This pristine setting includes a section of the West Fork of the Pigeon River, which is privately owned and stocked for the use of our camp. Campers receive instruction by volunteers in specialized fields such as herpetology (amphibians), geology, entomology (insects), botany, wetlands



ecology, stream restoration techniques, and environmental policy. In addition, fly fishing is covered in detail with topics such as casting, fly tying, equipment, streamside etiquette, knot tying, and how to find the fish.



Our Goals are threefold:

1. To have each camper leave with a lasting appreciation of the importance of environmental preservation & protection.
2. To have him or her become an active participant in efforts ensuring clean water and habitat for generations to come.
3. To learn about fly fishing and have a great time at camp.



Campers are lodged in multiple room cottages. Each bedroom has a set of twin beds and a private bathroom. All linens and towels are provided. Meals are served in a modern dining hall, part of which is set up as a permanent "classroom".

## About RIVERCOURSE

- The goal of Rivercourse is to introduce the campers to coldwater conservation and fly fishing.
- Campers will receive on-stream fly fishing instruction mornings and evenings.
- Campers will participate in a field trip to the nearby Davidson River to learn about the importance of riparian buffers. Their planting of some native species will reinforce the lesson. Also included are fish dissection and a tour of the fish hatchery.
- Classroom instruction is both outdoors and indoors.
- Swimming is an optional activity under adult supervision with certified lifeguards.
- Subjects are taught by volunteers from Trout Unlimited, the NC Wildlife Resource Commission, the US Forest Service, the US Park Service, and other organizations.
- TU chapters and members throughout the state support the camp with time, money, and materials.
- A **Rivercourse Fund** has been established to produce annual income for sponsorships and operational expenses.
